### THANKS FOR A GREAT YEAR!

It's been an exciting year for InvestED! Thanks to you, we supported 25,245 students in 660 secondary schools throughout the state, setting a record for the greatest number of students served in our 54-year history! InvestED distributed \$924,990 during the 2016-2017 school year and set a goal of distributing \$2,000,000 by 2020 to increase the number of students we can serve.

We launched a pilot program to determine strategies that will lead to a greater impact on attendance, engagement and graduation rates. The data we are collecting from our pilot program will help identify ways to maximize our programs.

Our partnership with the Seattle Seahawks on the special license plate program continues to impact the lives of students throughout our state! InvestED receives \$28 for every Seattle Seahawks license plate sold or renewed. As of November 2017, nearly 19,000 Seahawks fans had purchased specialized plates making it the fastest growing special plate sales in the state. It's a win-win for students in Washington state when you purchase Seahawks plates!

"This year we had a student who was very nervous about participating in PE class. He would skip school, not suit up, and express his frustration with having to take PE in general. In sitting down with him, we discovered that he had some fears about what others would think of him. He didn't have many PE clothing options, and the clothes he did have for PE showed his eczema, a condition that was embarrassing to him. Coming from middle school last year, this student was identified as having several markers for dropping out.

We were able to access InvestED funds to help him with PE clothes. He received the highest grade ever in PE and has been very connected to school, peers, and teachers. **This student has come out of his shell and now enjoys school.**

I attribute this to him advocating for himself and having access to InvestED funds. It transformed his school experience."



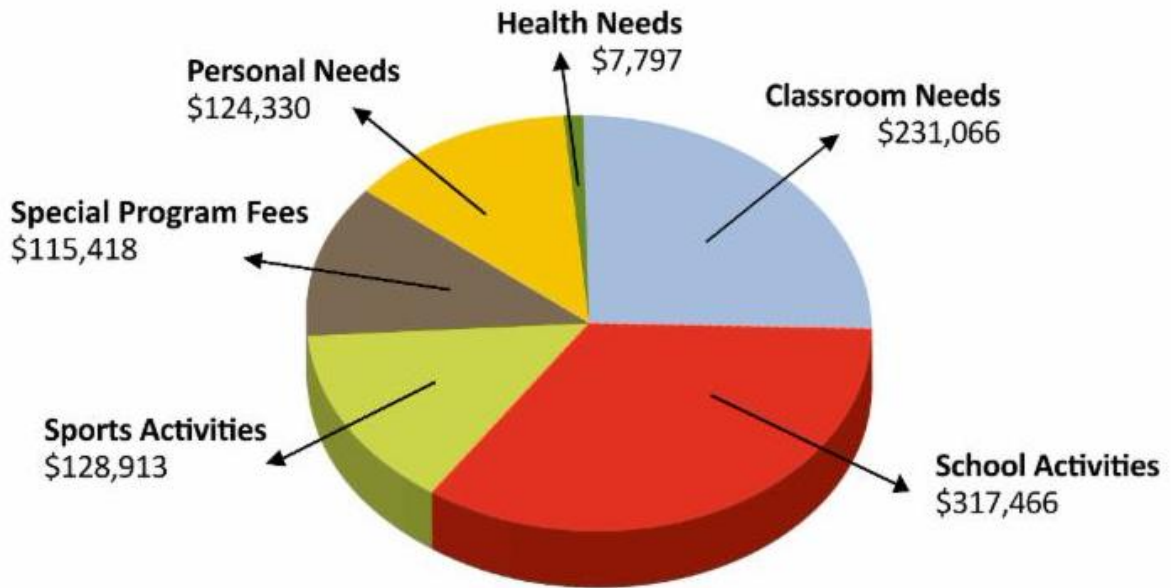

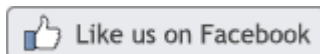
